

ORDINANCE NO. 99-04 (MOP)

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE REQUIREMENT OF STREET AND ROAD NUMBERING.

SECTION 1. Requirement of display of numbers.

Each separate residence and business in the incorporated area of the Town of Sterlington shall display the municipal street or road number which has been assigned to it in a manner and location whereby it is easily visible from a public street or road from both directions.

SECTION 2. Type of display.

The municipal street or road number shall be displayed in lettering no less than three (3) inches in height, and be easily and readily visible. The display may, but need not be, illuminated. However, if the display is not illuminated, then the display must be reflective.

The foregoing ordinance having been duly introduced at the regular meeting of April 20, 1999 of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, Town of Sterlington and the notice of it having been published in the official journal pursuant to R.S. 42:7, and the same having been read by title at the regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on May 18, 1999 and called for final passage and submitted to a final vote as a whole, the vote thereon being:

ORDINANCE NO. 2005-05 (MOP)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 99-04 (MOP) BY ADDING SECTION 3, INTENTIONAL REMOVAL AND PENALTIES.

SECTION 3. Intentional removal, penalty.

Intentional removal of required numbering, without reinstallation of that or other numbering which complies with the provisions of this section, is hereby declared to be unlawful, and shall subject the offender to a fine of up to thirty-five dollars (\$35) for the first offense, and up to two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for any subsequent offense within a five (5) year period.

The foregoing ordinance having been duly introduced at the regular meeting of July 19, 2005 of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, Town of Sterlington and the notice of it having been published in the official journal and the same having been read by title at the regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and called for final passage and submitted to a final vote as a whole, the vote thereon being:
