

ORDINANCE NO. 88-02 (OTG)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF STERLINGTON that whereas Article VI Section 10 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974 mandates that each municipality of the State prepare and publish a code containing all of the general ordinances of each municipality and make copies thereof available to such persons as may have need of them, and


WHEREAS the Town has prepared and codified its ordinances in the code attached hereto and made part hereof,

NOW THEREFORE, the said code is hereby adopted and each section thereof enacted as an ordinance of the Town of Sterlington. All general ordinances hereinafter adopted by the Board of Aldermen shall be enacted as amendments and additions to this code, which shall be cited as Sterlington Town Code of 1988.

The foregoing ordinance having been duly introduced at a regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, Town of Sterlington and the notice of it having been published in the official journal pursuant to R.S. 33:406, and the same having been read by title at the regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on March 15, 1988, and called for final passage and submitted to a final vote as a whole, the vote thereon being:



The ordinances can be logically organized into eleven categories as follows:

- ABC - Alcohol Beverage Control
- BCO - Building Code
- MOP - Maintenance of property by owners
- OTG - Organization of Town Government
- SED - Sewerage and Drainage
- SAS - Streets and Sidewalks
- TRA - Traffic Control
- TAX - Taxes
- UTL - Utilities
- VAM - Violations and Misdemeanors
- WAT - Water

The three letter code is for identifying the subject matter of an ordinance without reference to its full title.

Having reached 100 in the consecutive numbering system in use since 1961, ordinances hereafter will be numbered by the year they are passed followed by a consecutive number for that year and the three letter code.
